New Opportunities

- Availability of critical raw materials identified by the EU. including: Fluorspar. tungsten. tantalum, niobium, or strontium, which are all currently being mined. Deposits of phosphates from old mines and indication of graphite, cobalt, and rare earths.
- Opportunities related to **electric batteries** with 3 Mt of Nickel - Copper reserves and the discovery of multiple Lithium deposits.

Regulatory Framework: Open to foreign investment

- Foreign Ownership: There are no restrictions on foreign investment and ownership of companies involved in mineral exploration and extraction in Spain.
- Processing of mineral resources: Typically, there are no restrictions or limitations on the processing of minerals in Spain, with the exception of general regulations that may apply (e.g. environmental protection, avoidance of labour
- Royalties: The awarding, transfer, lease, or levy of mining rights is subject to the payment of taxes to the competent authorities, but there are no royalties based on amounts produced.

Tax benefits for mining activity

- Freedom of amortization for a 10-year period for investments in exploration, investigation, exploitation or benefit of mineral deposits and geological resources.
- · A depletion allowance in the case of priority minerals of up to 30% of the total consolidated tax base, conditional on reinvestment in exploring new resources or rehabilitating the area affected by the mine
